Dr. Peer Gebauer

Since 2005, Gerd Paffenholz is a member of the Project Team and international representative of Bioenergy Village Jühnde. The village is located in Lower Saxony in the Northwest of Germany close to Göttingen. Jühnde was one of Germany's first villages to produce heat and electricity using renewable biomass such as silage and wood chips, thus creating a CO2 neutral balance. Mr. Gerd Paffenholz studied electrical engineering in Hannover and has previously been a sales engineer for Mahr GmbH, a German SME specialized in industrial measuring technology.

Mr. Saithsiri is passionate about small Energy Generating Station (EGS) so that each community can turn their own municipal solid waste and agriculture waste to energy supply. This concept is named "The sustainable cycle". Mr. Saithsiri holds a Master's degree in Business Administration (Executive MBA) from the National Institute of Development Administration (NIDA), Bangkok, and a Bachelor's degree in Electrical Engineering of King's Mongkut Institute of Technology Ladkrabang (KMITL).
