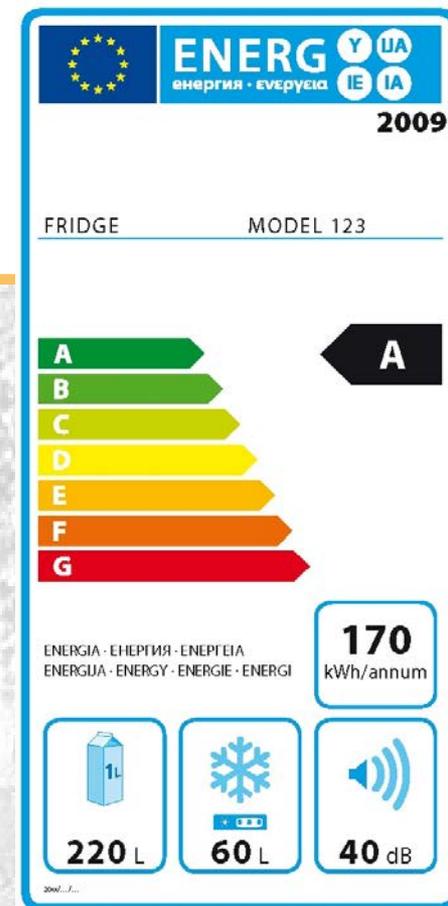
Status Quo in Europe

- Hundreds of labelling schemes
- Many of them sector specific
- Some with a general approach (e.g. EU Ecolabel, Blue Angel, Nordic Swan)
- Many labels and claims not reliable (‘Greenwashing’)
- Diversity and lack of reliability leads to e.g.
 - high transaction costs for and limited use by producers and retailers
 - confusion of consumers
 - problems for public procurement offices



EU Energy Label

- Regulation
- Mandatory
- 12 Product Groups, e.g.:
 - white goods,
 - lamps,
 - TV sets
- Close link to Ecodesign Directive
- Energy efficiency and other product related information
- Well known and accepted by consumers
- A vs. A+++
- Significant impact on product development and greening markets





European Eco Label



- Start in 1992
- Based on EU regulation
- European Ecolabel Board
- Management by Competent Bodies on national level
- 31 product groups, about 1400 licenses, 25.000 products and services
- Most important product groups: floor coverings, paints, varnishes, cleaners, paper
- Most important countries: Italy, France, UK



EU Ecolabel vs. National Labels

- Regulation in place:
- National criteria have to be at least as strict as EU Ecolabel criteria
- EU Ecolabel shall take into account national ecolabel criteria
- Simplified procedure under EU Ecolabel possible when national label is used
- Same goal: „Greening the markets“
- „Co-operation“ and harmonisation envisaged but also competition



Blue Angel



- First ecolabel in the world
- Logo given by UN,
- Well known (about 80%) and taken into account for purchasing decisions (about 40%)
- More than 120 product groups
- More than 14000 products and 1000 companies
- Most important product groups: Paints, printers, recycled paper
- Stands for environmental quality and credibility
- Blue Angel used by international companies and also on international markets
- Cooperation with other labelling schemes (e.g. China, South Korea, Ecomark Africa, European Flower etc.)



How does the Blue Angel work?



- **1. The Federal Ministry for the Environment, Nature Conservation, Building and Nuclear Safety** – is the owner of the label and regularly informs the public of the decisions of the Environmental Label Jury.
- **2. The Federal Environment Agency** – develops the technical criteria for the Basic Award Criteria for the Blue Angel and acts as the office of the Environmental Label Jury.
- **3. The Environmental Label Jury** – is an independent decision-making body composed of representatives from environmental and consumer associations, trade unions, industry, trade, crafts, local authorities, science, media, churches and federal states.
- **4. The RAL gGmbH** – organises and holds the expert hearings. It is also responsible for reviewing applications and awarding the eco-label on the basis of the existing award criteria for products and services.





Development of Criteria

- Criteria development under the Blue Angel labelling scheme
- Based on scientific studies
- Dialogue with producers
- Stakeholder involvement
- Ambitious criteria (best 25% of the market)
- Updated on a regular basis (4 years or less)





Fighting the `Label Jungle`

- Development of criteria for label/standard assessment
- Process with several Federal Ministries in Germany
- GIZ and Federal Environmental Agency
- Using international work as a basis:
 - GEN
 - ISEAL Alliance
- Assessments to be used for
 - consumer information
 - public procurement
- Possible model role for Europe

- Credibility
- Applicability
- Transparency
- Consumer acceptance
- Big size of the market
 - Cooperation (and possibly harmonisation) amongst type 1 labelling schemes
 - use in public procurement

Mechanism of green public procurement in Japan

1. There is a legal mechanism that the Law on Promoting Green Purchasing, which is constructed from 2000 in Japan, national and local governments is promoting green purchasing.
2. The Law on Promoting Green Purchasing has set with its own criteria. In order to meet the criteria of the Law on Promoting Green Purchasing, acquisition of eco labels is not required. It is a mechanism which if they meet the criteria of the Law on Promoting Green Purchasing, companies can declare by themselves.
3. At present, national government has implemented green purchasing in the green purchasing items of almost all .

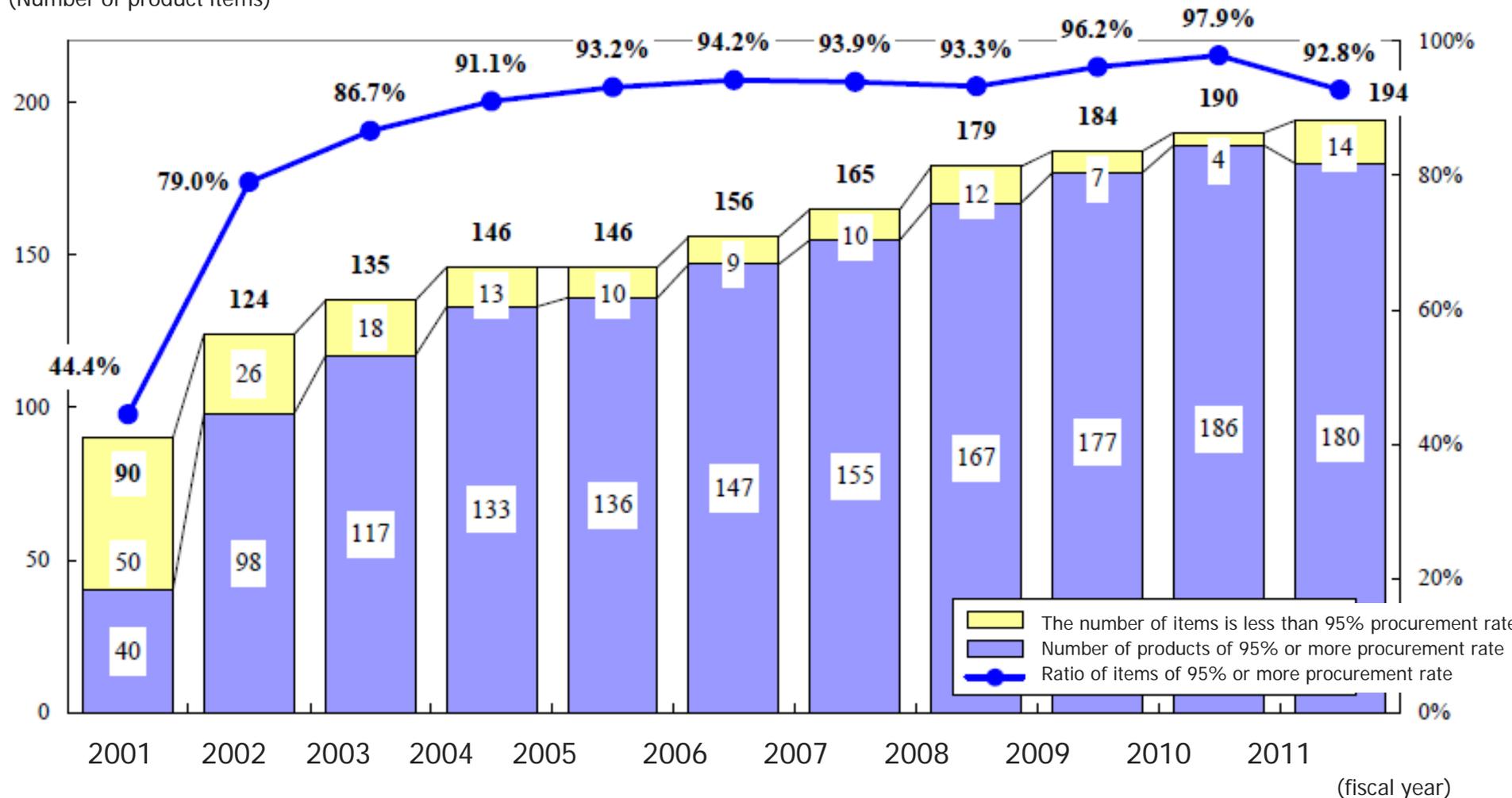

GPN was launched in April 2014 a service that can be downloaded the Law on Promoting Green Purchasing products as a PDF file or CSV file.



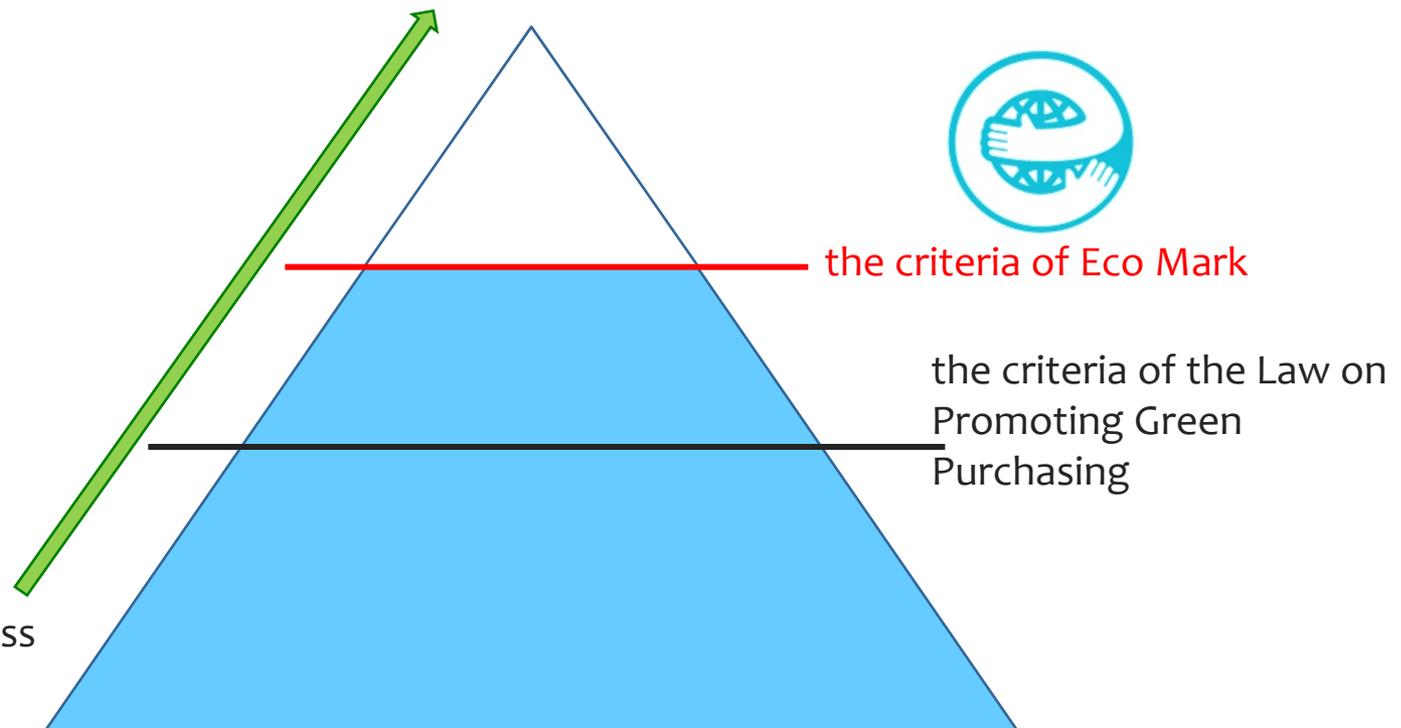

Positioning of Eco Mark in the Law on Promoting Green Purchasing

- Eco Mark is the third-party certification program which started in 1996.
- Eco Mark is upward-compatible with the criteria of the Law on Promoting Green Purchasing.
- It is possible to implement green purchasing higher level with purchasing products which Eco Mark certified.



D-1. Efforts to ensure the reliability of environmental information of the product

By in 2008 an affair of recycled paper products that contained less recycled paper than claimed, the Ministry of the Environment have started efforts to ensure the reliability of the information. the Ministry of the Environment formulated “Guideline for environmental labeling” and “Guideline for ensuring reliability”. The Ministry of the Environment has been working to spread these two guidelines to companies.

E. Role of GPN in the Law on Promoting Green Purchasing (2) "Ensure the reliability"

1. GPN performs the report about the measure to secure reliability of the information in cooperation with Ministry of the Environment.
2. GPN has tried to improve the method for checking the environmental information of products in the "Eco-products net" to ensure the reliability of them, that links to the effort of the Ministry of the Environment.



E-1. Summary about measures to ensure the reliability of the environmental information of the products

- Continuous approach to the businesses is also important to ensure reliability and not to fade the past efforts.
- According to the results of the survey, although there is a difference on a scale of businesses and industry, the challenge of encourage the efforts of green purchasing to the business who have not been aware of green purchasing has still remained.
- It becomes important not only the information from the supplier side but also the exchange of information among procurement staffs and retail distributors bi-directionally. And the opportunity to get consumer educations like environmental education continuously is also necessary.
- If you describe that they are green purchasing items to catalog, etc., you should be stated whether they comply with the criteria of which fiscal year.
- Although Use of third-party certification system is useful, it is also important that the businesses understand the significance of the self-declaration of conformity, because they can self-declare the conformity of the criteria of the Law on Promoting Green Purchasing.

E-1. 情報の信頼性を確保するための施策に関するとりまとめ

- 古紙と再生プラスチックの配合率調査手法については、問題発生を抑止力として有効であった。
- 信頼性確保の取組について、取組の経過などを風化させないためにも事業者側への継続的な働きかけが重要である。
- 調査結果では業界や事業者の規模で差があるとなっているが、中小事業者が多い業界や新規参入事業者が多い業界など、グリーン購入を意識してこなかった事業者をどのように巻き込んでいくかという課題が残っている。
- 供給側の情報提供だけではなく、流通事業者や調達者を巻き込んだ形の双方向性をもった情報のやり取りが重要になってくる。環境教育も含む消費者教育を継続的に受けられる場が必要である。
- カタログ等へ特定調達物品の適合品の記載をする場合、何年度の基本方針に適合しているのかを表示すべき。
- 第三者認証制度の活用も有用だが、グリーン購入法の適合表示は事業者による自己適合宣言による取組となるので、事業者が自己適合宣言の意義を理解することが重要である。

F-1. The views on ensuring the reliability of environmental information of the product (1)

- The supply chain of environmentally friendly products, that is not completed only in Japan, companies buy materials and components from overseas suppliers in many cases.
- Therefore, efforts to ensure reliability of the information is necessary not only in Japan but also spread abroad.
- To do so, it is required that the contents and format of the information through the supply chain is aligned.
- There are some cases that the criteria such as eco label are different with each countries and regions, it is truly necessary that the transmission of information on reliability should be harmonized.



F-2. The views on ensuring the reliability of environmental information of the product (2)

- In addition, not only spread to the product supplier, that procurement staffs have the knowledge of green purchasing is important.



G-1. Role of GPN in the Law on Promoting Green Purchasing (2) "Training for purchasing staff"

- The Ministry of the Environment has doing a questionnaire about the green purchasing efforts of local governments every year, and the result of it is published. GPN has workshops and seminars for procurement staffs of companies and local governments to promote their green purchasing.

Workshop for introducing green purchasing

- Try to make a rule to continue the purchase of environmental label products in the office
- To make the presentation materials for proposing to boss the introduction of green purchasing
- To connect the green purchasing (waste reduction, economic measures) and administrative measures high priority

A concrete and operational outcome of Rio+20

“ Fundamental changes in the way societies produce and consume are indispensable for achieving global sustainable development. All countries should promote sustainable consumption and production patterns, with the developed countries taking the lead and with all countries benefiting from the process, taking into account the Rio principles...” ([A/CONF.216/5](#) , para 1.a)

10YFP main objectives

Accelerate the shift towards SCP in all countries by supporting regional and national policies and initiatives

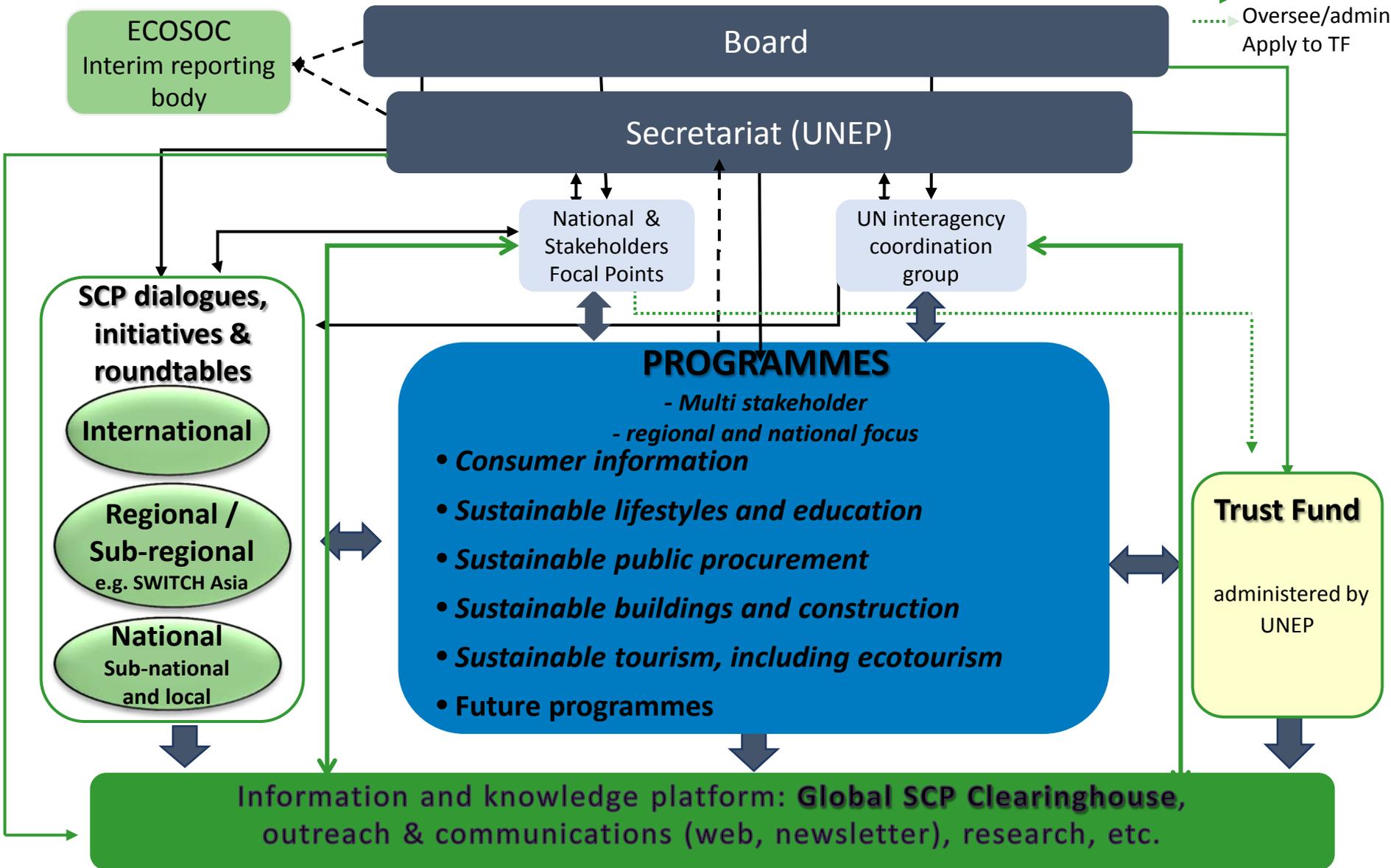
Support **capacity-building** and facilitate access to **financial and technical assistance for developing countries**, to implement SCP activities at all levels.

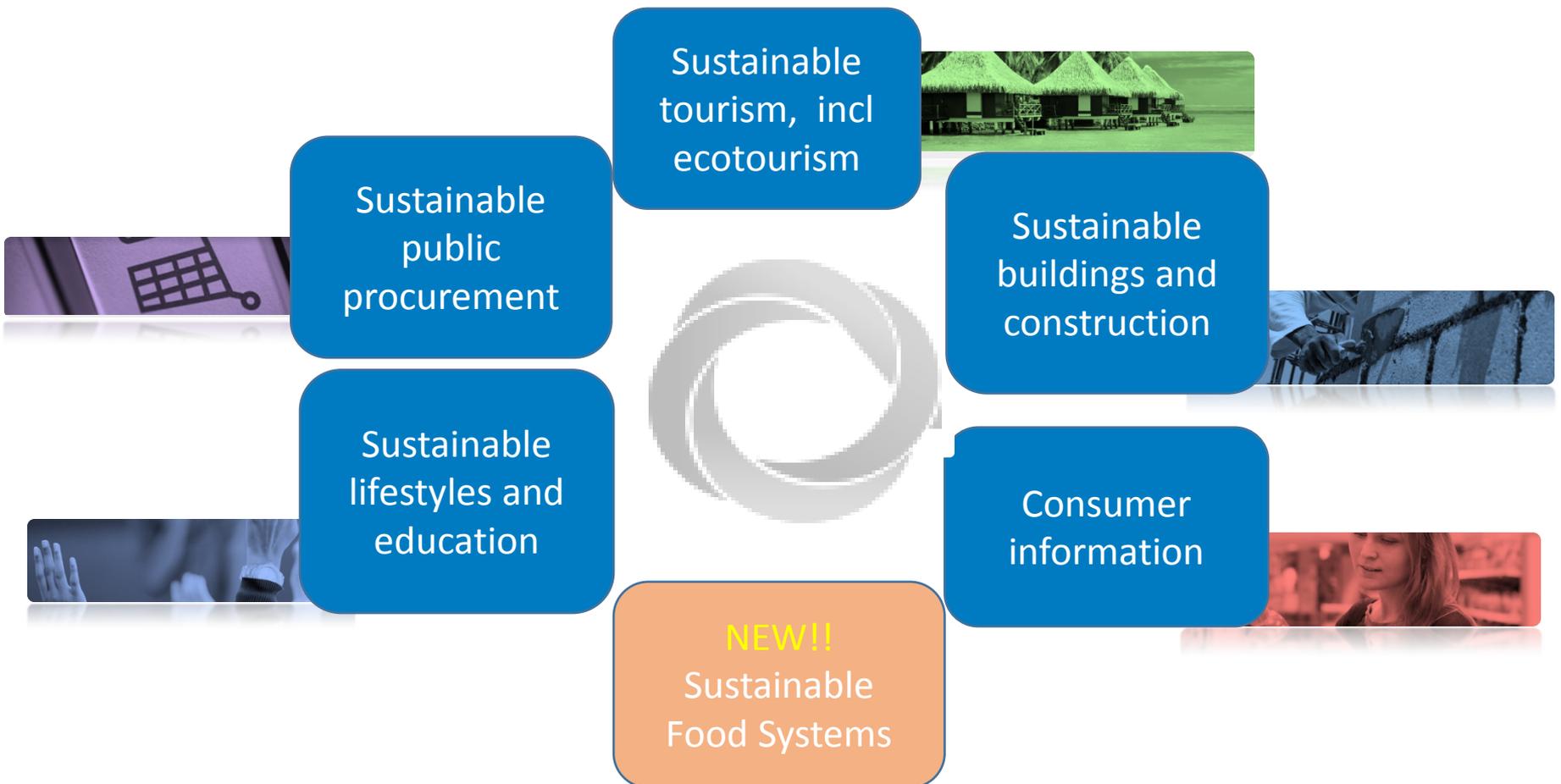

The programmes and the 10YFP Trust Fund

- UNEP and the 10YFP Secretariat responsible for establishing and administering 10YFP Trust Fund
- The Programmes actors can prepare project proposals to receive support from the 10YFP Trust Fund in developing countries and countries with economies in transition
- The leads/co-leads and MACs will advise on a short list of eligible project proposals to received financial support from the Trust Fund. They will:
 - Screen project proposals related to the specific 10YFP programme, ensuring relevance and that proposals respond to 10YFP objectives and 11 criteria
 - Provide feedback on proposals and technical advice



Regional work of the 10YFP: Asia and Pacific

- The region **launched its roadmap for 10YFP implementation on 28 April 2014**, based on several years of work in the region (SWITCH-Asia) and consultation with policy makers at the 1st Asia Pacific Meeting of the 10YFP (Nov. 2013).
- The region has over 10 priorities, including:
 - **National and regional indicators on SCP**
 - **Sustainability reporting**
 - **Eco-labels**
 - **Eco-innovation and adaptation of new technologies for cleaner production**
- Regional meetings:
 - **First Asia Pacific Meeting of the 10YFP - 7-8 Nov 2013, Bangkok, Thailand**

Asia and Pacific Roadmap for 10YFP implementation

The Sustainable Public Procurement Initiative (SPPI) officially became the 10YFP SPP Programme on April 1st at an event in New York, at the margins of the 10th Session of the Open Working Groups on Sustainable Development Goals

As such, the 10YFP SPP Programme officially adopted the Goals, Work Plan, Structure, MAC, and Modus Operandi of the SPPI



10YFP SPP Programme

- **Goal**

Promote worldwide implementation of SPP through **increased cooperation** between key stakeholders and a **better understanding of its potential benefits and impacts**.

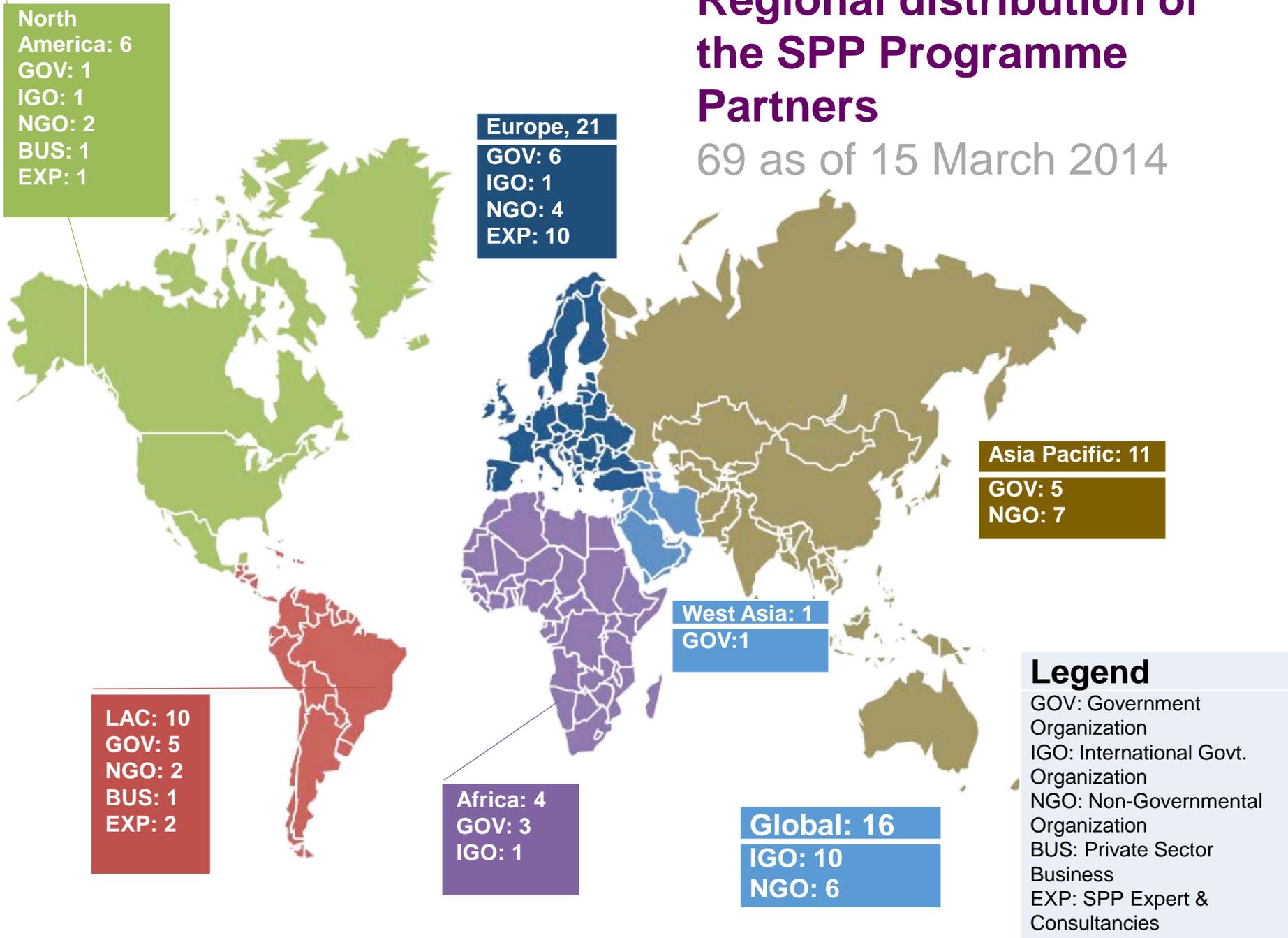
- **Objectives**

- **Build the case for SPP:** improve the knowledge on SPP and its **effectiveness** as a tool to promote greener economies and sustainable development;
- Support **the implementation of SPP on the ground** through increased collaboration and improved coordination between SPP stakeholders.

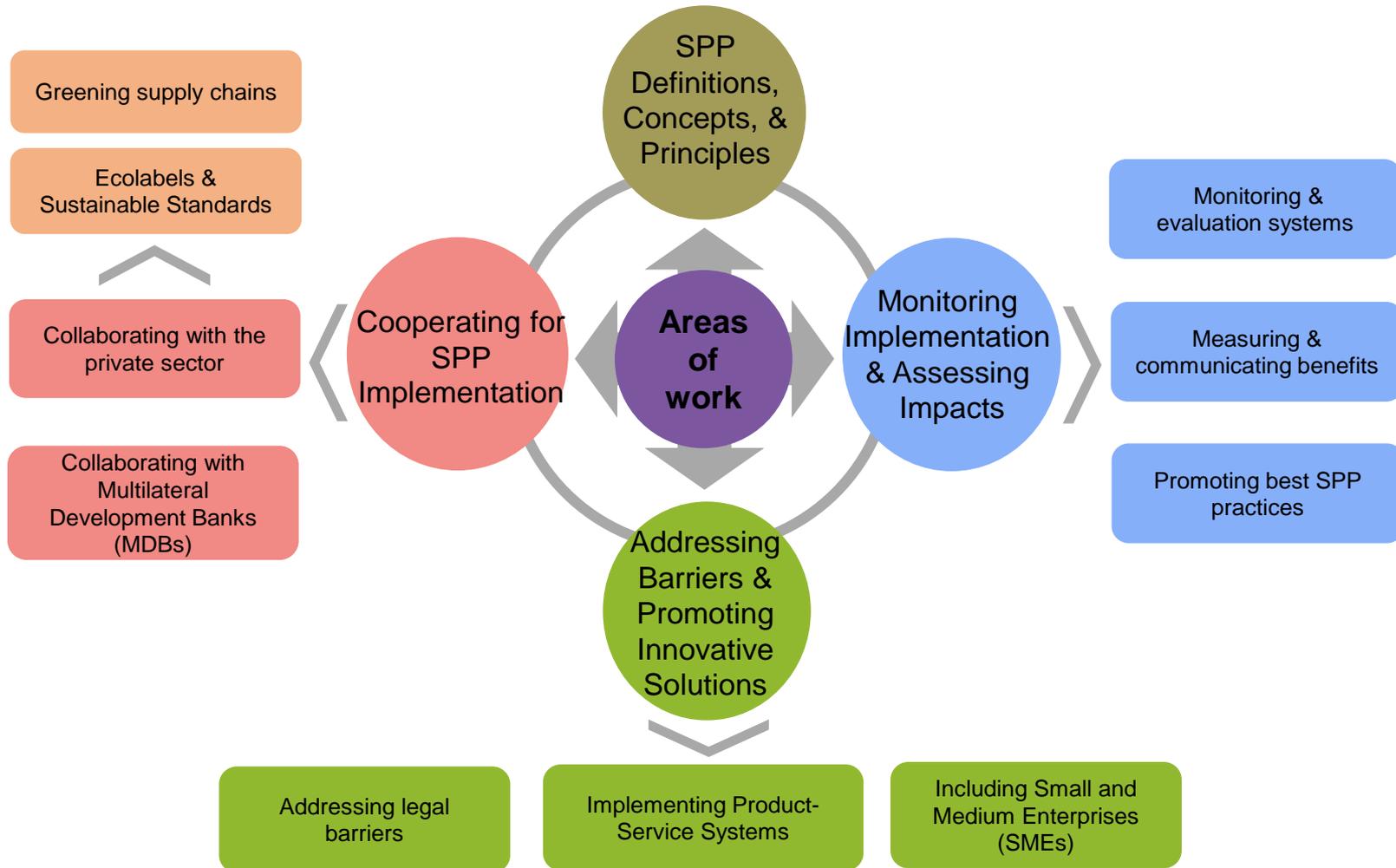


Regional distribution of the SPP Programme Partners

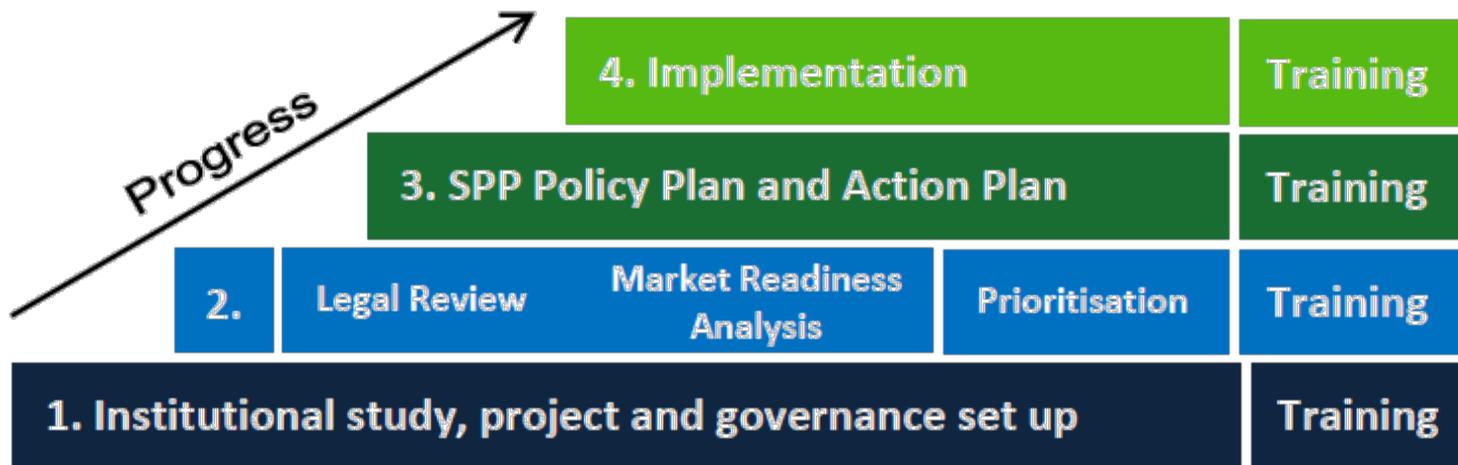
Sustainable Public Procurement Training Toolkit

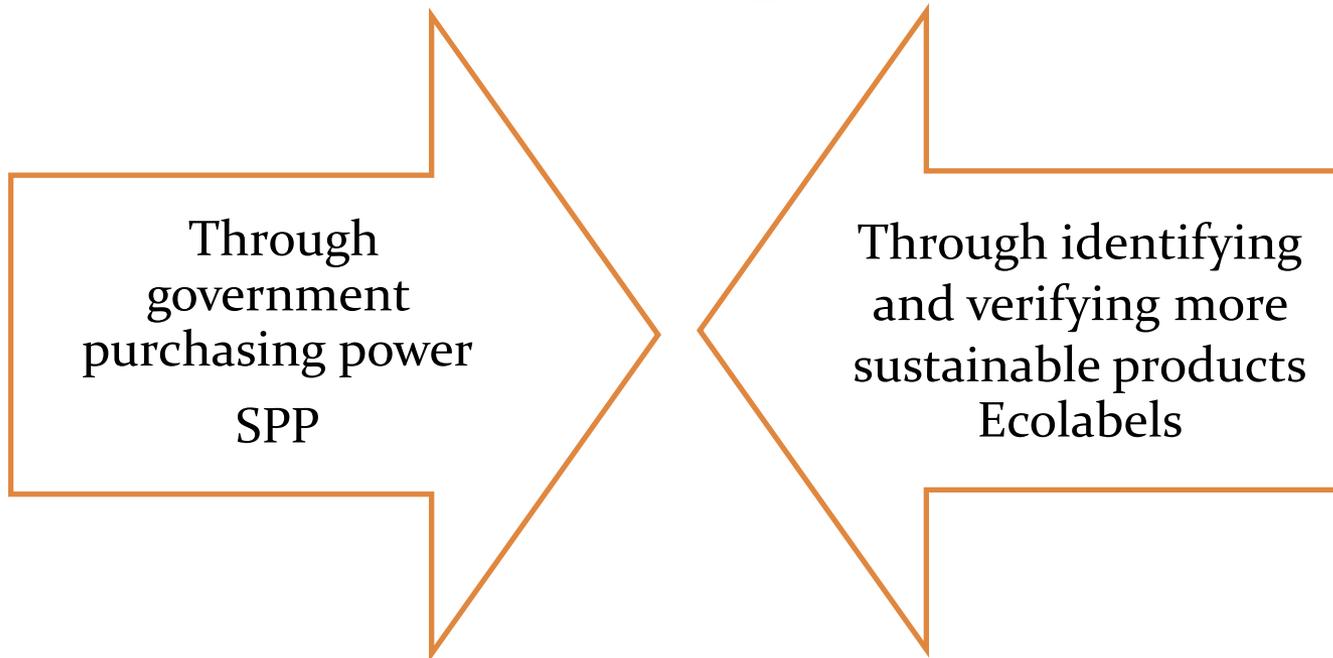

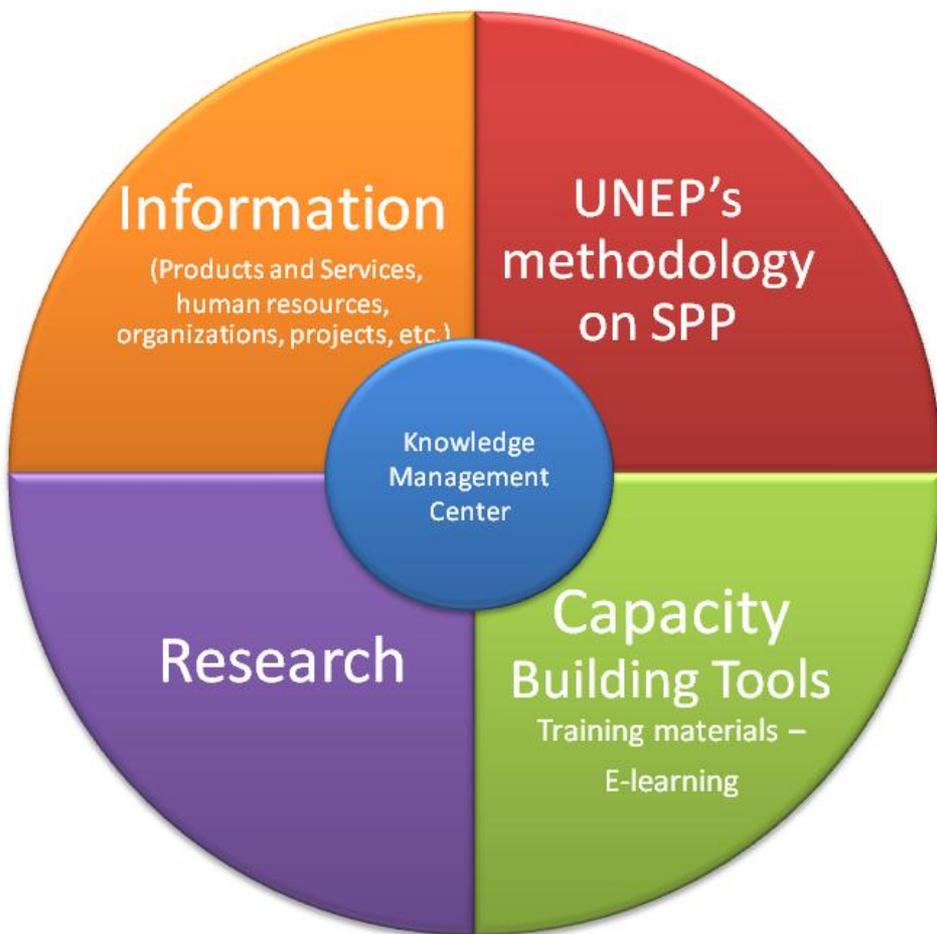
